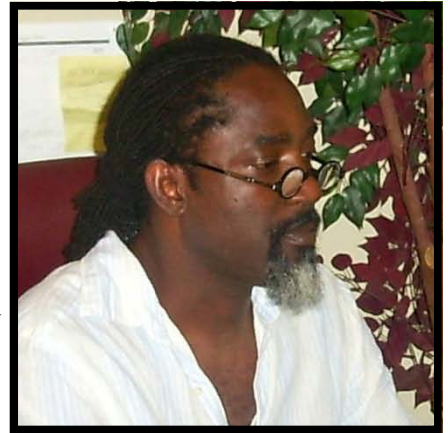

40th Church Anniversary

In the spring of 2011, the Second Missionary Baptist Church will be celebrating their 40th Church Anniversary! The celebration will host a reunion of all past and current members of the church. Second Missionary Baptist Church did not start out as "the church on a hill." March 17, 1971 marked the beginning of the church's organization and the late Rev. W.W. Wright, Sr. was called into the leadership position as Pastor. Over the years, the church grew in both membership and ministry, and it was on April 25, 1985 that Pastor Wright's God-given vision of a new building and new location was manifested. The deed to the new building was secured and the first service took place on Thanksgiving Day 1998 by Pastor Price coming from Psalms 116:17, "The Sacrifice of Thanksgiving."

On May 5, 2000, the baton of Pastor was made ready and was passed down from Rev. W.W. Wright to Rev. Charles E. Price, Sr. The church has evolved into a church emphasizing expository preaching and teaching through the whole council of God, encouraging the obtainment of sound doctrine and Bible study.

As the Lord continues to bless the Second Missionary Baptist Church and use it for the expansion of His kingdom, the festivities of the 40th Church Anniversary will be a time to celebrate and remember from where the Lord has brought this body of baptized Christian believers.
